Guidelines for submission

Authors are invited to submit paper abstracts and panel proposals in English by **30 April 2019**. Abstracts and proposals should be limited t 300 words for a paper and 1,000 words for a panel. They should include: 1) the title of the paper or panel; 2) name, institution and email address of the author(s); 3) up to five keywords. The CCLP will cooperate with the ECLS in peer-reviewing the submissions. Decisions of either acceptance or rejection will be communicated by **30 May 2019**. Full papers should not exceed 6,000 words, and be produced by **15 July 2019**.
